Mission San Jose Elementary School and the Berkeley Bishops play a Match

On Monday, January 29th the Berkeley Bishops, a team representing the Berkeley Chess School, one of the top scholastic chess schools in Northern California, traveled to Fremont to play an 18-board match with Mission San Jose Elementary (MSJE) School. MSJE is the reigning (K-3 and K-6, 2005 and 2006) Northern California Elementary School Chess Champions.

Elizabeth Shaughnessy deserves all the credit for making this match happen. She made the initial proposal. She also arranged for her team to travel to Fremont on a school night so we could play at the usual meeting time of the MSJE Chess team.

The Berkeley Bishops is an All-Star Team that consists of the best players from the more than 140 schools where the Berkeley Chess School runs chess programs. The Berkeley Chess School runs programs at the most schools and is one of the most respected chess programs in Northern California. Elizabeth Shaughnessy, a former Irish Woman's chess champion and a former president of CalChess, founded the Berkeley Chess School in 1982.

This was a rematch of the 1997 battle in which the Berkeley Bishops played and defeated a higher rated MSJE team that had recently won the 1996 Grade Six National Championship after winning the 1995 Grade Five National Championship.

Because the Bishops consist of both elementary school players and junior high players Elizabeth agreed to let MSJE graduates currently at Hopkins Junior High School play for MSJE. Three Hopkins students played for MSJE on boards 4, 5, and 8. Since the Bishops had no players above 1400, MSJE decided it would not be correct to play our top graduate at Hopkins, Arthur Liou (1900+).

Elizabeth wanted to let all of her players that could travel compete in the match. However, we both wanted to keep the match competitive. As can be seen from the results table below the bottom Bishops were all rated below 800. Both Elizabeth and I expected that the higher rated and more experienced MSJE players would make short work of the bottom of the Bishops team. To prevent lower rated Bishops from hurting the team effort Elizabeth and I agreed to a 10-board varsity match and that the players beyond board ten would be a junior varsity match. After the match Elizabeth and I could only laugh about our inability to predict what would happen on the bottom boards.

A time control of game in 45 minutes was used to allow us to finish the games and get the Berkeley team home at a reasonable hour. The MSJE team consists of over 50 players and attendance at our Monday evening meeting is usually 45 or more. Elizabeth was to bring as many Bishops as could travel on a school night and they would play the top boards at MSJE with the Hopkins students placed in by their ratings. The positioning of the bottom of the MSJE team was done by ladder position rather than by ratings.

The match got started within ten minutes of our proposed 6:45 starting time. MSJE won two varsity games and one junior varsity game very quickly. However by 7:30 the varsity score was 2-2 and the Junior varsity score was 3-2 in favor of the Bishops.

MSJE won the varsity match by a score of 7.5 to 2.5. Three fourth graders, the three captains of the MSJE Chess Team, Jerome Sun, James Kwok, and Hemang Jangle, played and won for MSJE on the top three boards.

At the bottom the Bishops more than held their own. They won the JV match by a score of 5-3. The overall score was MSJE 10.5 Bishops 7.5.

The board one battle between the Bishops' Gabriel Lee (1346) and MSJEs' Jerome Sun (1535) is shown below.

I would like to thank Elizabeth and the Bishops for traveling to Fremont on a school night. All 36 players should be congratulated for completing the match without any problems or protests. A return match is planned for March 10th in Berkeley.
